I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid" John 14: 25-27

Greetings and salutations to all! Many of you have asked about this and I shared about it in a bible study class during Sunday school - yet another reason why everyone should attend!! But I realized not everyone was there so I thought I'd share again. The question someone asked is about the prayer I say at the beginning of my sermon. I've been mixing it up lately, but my "go to" prayer before I preach is: "Lord, hide me behind your cross today, that I may somehow be a dim reflection of your grace, hope, mercy and love for your people. Amen." If I'm being truly honest, I can't take full credit for this prayer. I can't remember his name right now, but there was a preacher I would listen to every Sunday while driving to church and he would open his sermons with the same words. I began thinking about what it meant and how I could personally make this a part of my life. At the time, I was still wrestling with the idea of going to seminary but mostly just in a lot of personal prayer as I discerned my call to ministry. As I began to really think about it, I "Googled" the first words and found out that there is an older, southern song called, "Hide me behind the cross". The chorus says this:

*"Hide me behind the cross, Where my gains become as loss.
And only Your glory is in view. Your power will be revealed
The more that I am concealed. Hide me behind the cross
So the world sees only You".*

I realized after reading those words that that is exactly what I wanted from the hearers of my message. I want others to be drawn to Christ and I have to constantly remind myself when I step into the pulpit that it is NOT ABOUT ME, but ALL about Christ. I truly believe that this is the inspiration that can only happen through the work of the Holy Spirit working through me. I say this same prayer before I write sermons too. Sometimes, they come out OK, other times, it is a struggle to come up with something that will make sense. I suppose that's why I always or somewhere in my sermon share a personal story. I believe my personal story helps me connect with others. Not to toot my own horn, but I have always believed that personal story, even the bad stuff, helps us connect to others. That is after all what life is about- one story after another. My story is just one snippet in God's great plan and it is the work of the Holy Spirit infused in my story that helps us understand how the Holy Spirit works in all things. I further believe it is the work of the Holy Spirit that reminds us daily of our important mission in this world. We are called to love one another and lift one another up. Sometimes we do that through our own personal stories and other times by simply speaking the truth in love to one another. The Holy Spirit is our advocate and the one who inspires us to do all we do. It is a task that only God can do within us. We would do well to remember that in all we say and do. Because maybe there is someone you know whose Spirit needs to be inspired by YOUR story, by YOUR presence. Maybe today, we remember to all "hide behind the cross" and allow God to be first in our lives so that we can truly allow the work of the Holy Spirit to be visible to others through us.

As we approach Holy Week, be sure to invite friends and family to attend. Don't forget we will once again join with hundreds of others in our community to do the "Walk to Calvary" using the hike and bike trails from First United Methodist all the way to ILC beginning at noon

The cross is always our reminder of all God did for us through Christ by the work and power of the Holy Spirit. May the light of Easter dawn be our focus this Easter season and always!
