"Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things."
1 Corinthians 13:4-8

As we embark on a new year with a new council, (hopefully) approving a new church budget, a new 501-3c meeting here at Immanuel, I can't help but think of the old Captain and Tennille song, "Love will keep us together". (I give you permission to pause for a second, while you YouTube the song or sing the song in your head!). Maybe I'm thinking of love so much as I personally prepare for a new nephew in my family, or maybe it's the Girl Scout cookies on my brain or maybe it's because Valentine's Day is right around the corner. Whatever it is, I do know this- as I turn on my TV to watch the news each evening, just to ensure I know what's happening in our world, LOVE seems to be a word in short supply.

It got me to thinking about how rarely we authentically say "I love you" to other people each day. The word "love" appears 538 times in scripture. The little chart I found online indicated that this was more than the words "light", "pray" or even "sin". I have shared this before but in Greek there are 3 TYPES of words for love. *Eros*, which is sexual in nature, *philo* which is a friendship type of love. The one used here that Paul uses in his letter to Corinth he uses 9 times in 13 verses! This is the one most people know- *agape*, which is "a sacrificial love; an act of the will which places the welfare of others above the interest of oneself".

If you were to go back and read the passage above, keeping this definition in mind, I think it really changes its meaning. It is for this reason that many people select this verse when they marry- however, I don't think that's how Paul intended for it to be used! After all a marriage shouldn't be about "placing the welfare of one above/over another" but rather about an equal partnership. For Paul, he felt this definition was meant to teach us that "love" is the essential ingredient in the Christian life. His intent was to convey/teach that this "love" is meant to be superior to all other Christian gifts and virtues. On the surface this may seem like a really tall order, but I believe that it is through the work of Holy Spirit that enables us to love as Paul's "agape" implies. It is THIS love in which we should aspire to. It is THIS love that truly "never ends and endures all things". As our faith is nourished and grows, I believe we then gain the peace that can only come from Christ which then fuels our ability to love as Paul's "love"/"Agape" implies....sacrificially.

When you really think about it, there are many in our church who serve our church and community because they carry a passion or this "agape", sacrificial love for a certain cause. In a world which seems so consumed with commercialism and hatred, it is my prayer for you all that you find a way to share YOUR "agape" sacrificial love within our church and community. I believe when we are willing to sacrificially love all that we do as a church, then we are willing to do whatever it takes to support it- that could mean financially but it can also mean giving/sharing your time. I believe that our church still has much to offer within our community. We have much to be thankful for. When we work together we can accomplish great things. As the old Captain & Tennille song goes, "Love will keep us together". May your love of Christ, be strengthened each day to "agape" love each other as God does you.

Baby Care Kits include the following **in sizes 6 - 24 months.** (Gently used, clean items (no stains or tears) can be substituted for new items - Note: Salvation Army Stores have half price sales every Wednesday!!!).

- Two lightweight cotton t-shirts (onesies can be cut and hemmed/serged to make a t-shirt)
- Two long or short sleeved gowns/sleepers without feet (top and pant sets/P.Js may be substituted for gowns/sleepers; sleepers with feet can be donated and WELCA members will cut off the feet and hem the legs)
- Two receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, up to 52" square
- Four cloth diapers (Walmart sales Gerber 10 pack cloth diapers for approximately \$12.00)
- One jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a baby cap
- Two pairs of socks
- One hand towel, dark color recommended
- Two or three bath-size bars of gentle soap, in original wrapping (8 to 9 oz. total weight)
- Two diaper pins or large safety pins

Food Pantry News for December

Number of clients assisted—110
Number of Family Members—357

Pflugerville Lion's Club is a strong supporter of the ILC Food Pantry. Their annual Chili Supper fundraiser is Friday, Feb. 17 serving from 5-8pm at 500 N. Railroad. Bring a friend and eat at the Hall or get it to go. \$10/person.

Stewardship Committee: The meeting was opened with a presentation, by Ralph, of an analysis of circumstances relating to the drop in attendance and giving that has occurred since 2012. In 2012 there were 16 transfers out; in 2014 was 45 and in 2014 was 23. Compared to 10 in 2010 and 5 in 2011. The average attendance for the same period was 323, 312, 297, respectively compared to 335 in 2010 and 323 in 2011.

Total receivables did not vary all that much across the same periods. What did vary was a major increase in the amount for designated giving between 2012 and 2014 reducing the amount for the general fund.

Ralph explained that he took the opportunity to talk with members of various committees and with coffee groups between services from November through December as to their take concerning the upcoming budget and problems, if any, each one felt might be contributing to lack of participation in church related activities, giving and attendance.

In summary, Ralph's conclusion was there is not enough transparency in the council actions, contributing to the lack of information which results in a great deal of misinformation that could well be the root cause of our problems.

Devorah Jakubowsky presented a proposed "Step Up Giving" approach to an increase in giving to meet the 5% increase in the 2017 budget. Ralph recalled that we had tried this several years past with minimal results. He would check the Stewardship minutes for that year and check the evaluation result to possibly avoiding making same mistakes. It was agreed we should give it try around Valentine's Day, with "the heart" in mind.
