It's 2017! I remember when I was a child and contemplated that I might live to celebrate the year 2017. I remember thinking that I would be very, very old, but if I lived to be as old as my grandparents, I would be alive for the celebration. What is so special about the year 2017, you ask? 2017 marks the 500th

anniversary of the Protestant Reformation initiated by Dr. Martin Luther! I attended Lutheran elementary school, and understanding the significance of the Reformation was very important. As a school child, celebrating the Reformation was especially exciting because every year the entire school would pause to watch the vintage 1950's black and white *Martin Luther* movie. By the time the school principal got the two reels threaded onto the movie projector (one or both of which would inevitably jam and/or need to be spliced), the one hour and forty-five minute movie pretty much guaranteed an entire afternoon out of class.

Today more than ever I believe understanding the significance of the Reformation is important. Throughout the coming year at ILC we will commemorate the Reformation in a variety of ways. This month during the Sunday School hour Pastor Rosy will lead a study of the book of Romans with an emphasis on how the Apostle Paul's writing inspired Luther's understanding of justification by grace alone through faith alone on account of Christ alone. In February, I will lead a study of Martin Luther's life. In March begins the Lenten season, and our Wednesday evening meditations will focus on Luther's Small Catechism. Other special themes are being planned for the remainder of the year, culminating with a special celebration on Reformation Sunday in October.

When I was a new pastor at ILC, I purchased a VHS copy of the old *Martin Luther* movie and showed it to the Confirmation students. What a snoozer! Fortunately, a newer version (in color!) came out a few years later. I'm sure we will watch it again at ILC sometime this year. If you come, I'll make popcorn. 😊 It's 2017! Happy Reformation New Year to you and yours!

The Women of the ELCA are asking for your help in collecting items for Lutheran World Relief Baby Care Kits. The items included in a Baby Care Kit provide the basic items a mother needs to keep her baby warm and clean. Baby Care Kits include the following in **sizes 6 - 24 months**. (Gently used, clean items (no stains or tears) can be substituted for new items - Note: Salvation Army Stores have half price sales every Wednesday!!!).

- Two lightweight cotton t-shirts (*onesies can be cut and hemmed/serged to make a t-shirt*)
- Two long or short sleeved gowns/sleepers without feet (*top and pant sets/P.Js may be substituted for gowns/sleepers; sleepers with feet can be donated and WELCA members will cut off the feet and hem the legs*)
- Two receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, up to 52" square
- Four cloth diapers (*Walmart sales Gerber 10 pack cloth diapers for approximately \$12.00*)
- One jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, *or include a baby cap*
- Two pairs of socks
- One hand towel, dark color recommended
- Two or three bath-size bars of gentle soap, in original wrapping (8 to 9 oz. total weight)
- Two diaper pins or large safety pins

Changes to the ELCA Model Constitution were made at the Church-wide Assembly in August. The primary changes relate to the merging of lay rosters for various Diaconal Ministers and Associates in Ministry into a single roster titled Ministers of Word and Service. Ordained pastors are designated as Ministers of Word and Sacrament. The ILC Council has reviewed these and other minor changes and recommends the amendments for approval at the January 29 annual meeting. A town hall meeting will be held Sunday, January 22, to explain the changes and answer questions. No other local amendments will be considered. The changes to the model constitution may be viewed at www.elca.org. The ILC Constitution with the proposed changes may be viewed at www.ilcpville.org or a printed copy may be requested from the church office.
