following verses:

On Sunday, July 2nd, our music theme at both worship services will be "God and Country." As we celebrate our nation's independence we will give thanks and praise to God for the freedom we enjoy, and for the men and women who, by the grace of God, have served and continue to serve to make our liberty possible. One of the hymns we will sing that day includes the

***"This is my song, O God of all the nations,
a song of peace for lands afar and mine.
This is my home, the country where my heart is;
here are my hopes, my dreams, my holy shrine;
but other hearts in other lands are beating
with hopes and dreams as true and high as mine.***

***My country's skies are bluer than the ocean,
and sunlight beams on cloverleaf and pine;
but other lands have sunlight too, and clover,
and skies are everywhere as blue as mine.
So hear my song, O God of all the nations,
a song of peace for their land and for mine."***

The lyrics were written in 1934 by Lloyd Stone and are sung to a well-known melody, *Finlandia*, written many years earlier by Jean Sibelius. The song is now in our red ELW hymnal. I remember the first time I heard the anthem. It was sung by choir students from Pflugerville High School and Connally High School as Pflugerville citizens gathered at Kuempel Stadium after September 11, 2001, to pray for the families of 9/11 victims, for our nation's leaders and military personnel, and for our nation's future. The bands from both high schools also combined to perform a patriotic tribute. Clergy and lay participants from area churches remembered our fallen heroes and entrusted our sorrow as well as our hopes and dreams to Almighty God. My personal belief is that God smiled, and perhaps even shed a tear, as hundreds of Pflugerville folks from different churches and different traditions united to pray with one voice.

Sixteen years later I believe the people of this community and of this great nation are still united by far, far more than the issues that divide us. Republicans, Democrats, and Independents, Christians and non-Christians alike pray for peace for our nation and for peace around the world. We stand united against those who promote violence and terrorism. We may disagree regarding ways and means, but we stand united in our desire to end poverty and strive for justice for refugees, for poor immigrants, and for those in need of health care. As we again celebrate and give thanks to God for this great nation, let us pray *together*, remembering the gifts of the Spirit which make us one. United, we stand. May God grant us grace so to be, as we gather and worship, grow in the Word, and serve God by serving people.

This tournament started and continues as a vehicle for supporting the Bible fund at Immanuel Lutheran Church and has evolved over the last four years to include supporting post-secondary education through scholarships for graduating High School seniors at Immanuel Lutheran Church and Hendrickson High School.

We work through a team each year to accept and evaluate essay entrants to award scholarships. To date, we have awarded 40 scholarship recipients over \$25,000 in post secondary education financial assistance. This year there were 25 essay entrants and 11 recipients were elected to receive varying amounts that totaled \$5400.

None of the Bible fund and Scholarship awards would have been possible without everyone's generosity! Immanuel Lutheran Church and the Lovetts thank you from the bottom of our hearts.

Stewardship Committee: Several examples of "pledge" cards were viewed and a combination of two was selected. As part of the pledge card process it was agreed, for the first year, only the number of pledges received would be announced without any reference to dollar amount. And there would be no follow up of the individual pledged amounts. As the Stewardship Committee representative for the Long Range Planning Committee, Dorothy Warren was asked to get a consensus of opinion on the two major items scheduled for the Town Hall meeting.

1. "Should we pursue the idea of hiring an office/facilities manager before considering the call of another pastor?"

2. "Should we sell the 6th street Parsonage or should we continue to rent it."

Response to question 2 was a 100% to sell the property with all of the proceeds going toward the Combined "New Loan" balance. Because there were other factors involved not specified, question 1 generated some discussion. The committee in general was not aware of the DS accounting move, future staff retirements. The committee in general agreed with the concept - just felt more information was needed as to how all this would come together.

From the Youth & Family Ministry Office...

June 5th - 9th was the middle school mission trip to Arlington, TX. We served with an organization called Mission Arlington for a few days, wow! What an experience we had!!

There were 13 young people and 2 adult leaders - each of these people would have amazing stories to share!

As ILC youth we have served with Mission Arlington before and each time we do I am struck by one thing. Mission Arlington was founded by an amazing lady - Tillie Burgin. She decided that if we could do missions to Korea we could do missions to our very own neighborhoods. She knew that if there was any chance at sharing the gospel of Jesus Christ with people, their physical needs would need to be met before they could really have ears to hear. She has made it her life's work to do just that. Mission Arlington operates a dental and medical clinic, clothing store, food pantry and furniture delivery services. These are the big pieces amongst a whole host of other things.

Mission Arlington also operates its various apartment complexes all over the city. There have been agreements made between the management and Mission Arlington that Mission Arlington can host bible study and worship in these apartment complexes weekly. There are missionaries who live in these apartment complexes who get to know the residents and do their best to find resources to meet their needs.

So, what is it that strikes me each time? It is the fact that one person decided to make a change. One person decided to do something to meet the needs she was seeing in her community. One person rallied her church and rallied her community to serve those who need help the most. The passion and dream that one person had was contagious and has grown into the beautiful ministry that is Mission Arlington.

Ms. Tillie keeps the Mission running because she gives all the glory and honor to God. She says that apart from Christ the Mission is nothing. Praise be God for this example, Praise be God that our young people got to experience just a taste of this ministry. May our hearts be turned to the least of these, may our passions and dreams be filled with serving others for the sake of Jesus Christ.

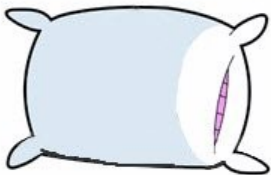
