I want to give some much deserved credit where credit is due. When ILC members express concern that I am once again a solo pastor, I tell them that nothing could be farther from the truth. Solo pastors don't have two office Secretaries who, together with a volunteer Facilities Manager, coordinate and perform nearly all of the church office administrative responsibilities. Solo pastors often are not blessed with a Youth and Family

Minister and a Parish Education Director in whom they have complete confidence and trust. They, like our Day School Director and her Staff, are self-starters, motivated by their God-given passion for ministry. Each of them performs their respective responsibilities with very little necessary oversight. My job as Senior Pastor is almost always simply to offer support and advice when requested. Mine is a truly enviable position. I remember sharing similar thoughts during the last pastoral interim. I should do so more often than every four years. I hope ILC members will join me in thanking the Church and Day School Staff.

There will be considerable staff turnover in the next few years. Those of us who will be completing our service here want to leave with everything, as much as possible, in good order. Because I respect so much their knowledge of this congregation and the nuts and bolts, day to day work of ministry that happens here, Staff members were the first people with whom I met to brainstorm possible staffing options as we move forward. I have shared with the Church Council the thoughts and opinions discussed by Staff members Beverly, Sherri, Ralph, Claudia, Katie, Susan, and me.

Needless to say, the decision is not mine to make, but with the Staff's approval, I have presented to the Church Council the idea of pursuing an office/facilities manager before considering the call of another pastor. Neither Beverly nor Sherri have announced how many more years they intend to work. Ralph may very well still be volunteering his time and expertise when he is 100 years old. Nevertheless, all three of them realize the importance of training someone to assume the many tasks they perform before they leave their positions. There may also be wisdom in waiting to call a new Senior Pastor before considering another Associate Pastor. Two years may seem like a long time to wait, but it is not an unusual length of time for a pastoral interim, and the time could certainly be used for congregational needs assessment and discernment. In the Fall of 2018, Katie will be leaving ILC to complete her Master of Divinity one-year internship and then graduate from seminary. Might our congregation then consider calling someone like her to serve as an Associate Pastor with an emphasis on Youth and Family Ministry?

In addition to staff transitions, we are once again confronted with the question of what to do with the 6th Street parsonage. Should it be sold? Should it again be rented? How long might it be, if ever, that another pastor wishes to live there? We will schedule a town hall meeting in the near future so that opinions and ideas might be shared about both the 6th Street parsonage and our staffing needs.

In closing, I want to thank the Holy Smokers for preparing the wonderful pork loin for Pastor Rosy's farewell luncheon. These men are always ready to serve, and what they do is a blessing and ministry of this congregation. And, I want to again thank the Church Staff—in particular, Sherri, Beverly, and Susan. The planning, purchasing, and preparation of the rest of the menu was all by their initiative and labor. The James Avery cross presented to Pastor Rosy was also purchased by the Staff.

I am grateful, too, for all the members who were able to attend the luncheon. On the following Committee night, I attended the Day School Board, Worship and Music, and Long Range Planning Committee meetings. I went home with a sense of God's peace. The Spirit is alive and working at Immanuel Lutheran Church and Day School. We are blessed with talented and faithful lay leaders and staff who serve God by serving people in this place. *Soli Deo Gloria* in whom our future rests secure.

Stewardship Committee: A general discussion was had of the ELCA Stewardship video viewed during the April meeting. In near term (2017) it was agreed we should use pledge cards this fall knowing response might be low. Pledge cards would be totaled as to the number responding and the total pledged. No attempt will be made for individual accounting. It was noted that pledge cards had been tried here at ILC several times but not on a continuing year after year program which was the key to success with the congregations in the presentation. Our need to instill Stewardship at an early age - it was agreed to implement a program for children starting with Rally Day. This will require identifying specific projects which children of ILC may fund through children's offering each Sunday. For example, as was the case with one of the congregations their school needed new playground item. A small slide was built and used during offering with the child placing their offering at the top and collecting it at the bottom of the slide. Ralph will work with Susan and Katie on possible needs that might be configured in some form of an action item as was the slide. Looking forward to the remaining months of the 2017 year, the committee is considering opening up the giving process to the use of debit and credit cards in addition to the present process of electronic giving.
