Throughout the year 2017 we are commemorating the 500th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation begun by Dr. Martin Luther. Luther led a renewal of church doctrine. His study of the Bible ultimately focused on "three solas"—grace alone, faith alone, and Word alone. We are justified and made right with God by grace alone, we receive this gift through faith alone, on account of the life, death, and resurrection of Christ alone, who is the eternal Word of God.

But equally important as Luther's reform of Church doctrine was his renewal of Church life, particularly the life and participation of lay people. Luther spoke of the "priesthood of all believers." He translated the Bible into the language of the people. That was huge. Previously it was available only to the clergy and scholars who studied Latin.

Still, even after the Bible was available in the language of the people, few common people could afford to own one. Between the years 1527–1529 Luther visited churches throughout Saxony to determine the general religious condition of Christian people. It prompted him to write his Small and Large Catechisms so that all Christians could learn a basic understanding of the Christian faith and teach it to their children. Each section of the Small Catechism begins, "As the Head of the Family Should Teach in a Simple Way to His Household." In our baptismal rite, parents promise to do just that. Of course, it takes a village to raise a child, and the Church assists parents in keeping that promise by offering Confirmation instruction and other Parish Education and Youth and Family Ministry opportunities.

The five parts of the original Small Catechism are The Ten Commandments, The Creed, The Lord's Prayer, Baptism, and the Lord's Supper. Those five parts will be the topics of our mid-week Lenten Holden Evening Prayer meditations. In 1531 the questions concerning the confession of sin at the end of the baptism section were expanded and printed as the 5th part, and the Sacrament of the Altar (The Lord's Supper) became the 6th part. In editions of the Small Catechism after Luther's death, this section was titled "The Office of the Keys and Confession." We will begin our Lenten discipline on Ash Wednesday with a review of this part of the Catechism. Come, confess your sin, pledge to amend your life, and receive Christ's body and blood in the Sacrament with the forgiveness and strength you need.

Ash Wednesday is March 1st and begins the season of Lent. Holy Communion services with the imposition of ashes will be offered at 10:00am in the Chapel and at 6:30 pm in the Sanctuary. Our Wednesday mid-week Lenten services will follow the same schedule the next five weeks with soup and sandwiches served in the Parish Hall beginning at 5:15 p.m. (note, no dinner will be served Ash Wednesday). Our Lenten theme this year is "500th Anniversary Protestant Reformation". Here are the weekly Scripture lessons:

March 8th — "The Ten Commandments" - Deuteronomy 4:1-2, 6-9

March 15th — "The Apostle's Creed" - Romans 10:8-13

March 22nd — "The Lord's Prayer" - Luke 11:1-13

March 29th — "The Sacrament of Holy Baptism" - Matthew 28:16-20

April 5th — "The Sacrament of the Altar" - 1 Corinthians 10:16-17

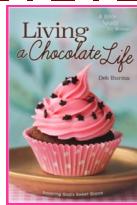
