In recent months our peace and security and the hopes and dreams and lives of people all across our land have been rocked by mass murders at music venues, churches and schools, and most recently by bombs that originated right here in our community. How do we see Jesus and experience the peace of Christ in the midst of our grief and pain and

despair? There is no simple explanation for the twisted behavior of the perpetrators, and there are no simple solutions to prevent these tragedies from happening. It is possible, though, to note some commonalities. The individuals responsible for the gun violence and bombs in the recent news have not been foreign terrorists acting on behalf of some radical religious ideology. They have been mostly young, white, American men, often from Christian families. In every instance they are individuals turned in on themselves with no regard for the lives of other people. To be turned in on oneself is the definition of original sin. To be concerned only for oneself is a temptation we all face. We confess our failure to love God and other people as we should. We are in need of a Savior.

"If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, God who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness." (1 John 1:8-9) Those words from scripture are familiar to Lutheran Christians. We begin nearly every worship service confessing that we are in bondage to sin and unable to free ourselves. Easter changes everything. Easter confirms that sin and death are defeated. For Jesus' sake, God forgives our human weakness and sets us free to live as God's children, at peace with God and with one another.

Christ is risen! Jesus is alive! He lives in you and me. As the body of Christ on earth, you and I are called to do what Jesus did, to give ourselves for the sake of others. Do you want to see Jesus in the midst of the pain and tragedy we experience? How might you touch the life of someone who is hurting with the love and compassion of Christ? Whether they are family members or complete strangers, when we open our lives to other people, when we see Christ in them and serve God by giving ourselves to them, they, by the grace and power of God the Holy Spirit, may see and experience the grace and love of God in us. Jesus is present in our lives and in our world. He's present when you see Christ in others; he's present when others see Christ in you. May it be true for you and for me, as we gather and worship, grow in the word, and serve God by serving people.

From Your Church Council

From a worship perspective, March was a busy and exciting month; but from a Council perspective, it was pretty quiet.

During our March 20 meeting, we reviewed reports from staff, committees, and Treasurer Kenneth Adix. All of these reports are on file in the church office, and are available for review.

The Treasurer's Report revealed that giving to the General Fund in February, and for the year so far, is about 25% below the budget for which we all voted in January. While that budget called for a 20% increase over the actual giving in 2017, these early numbers for 2018 show that in the first two months, total giving has barely increased over last year. Now that ILC is debt-free, we again appeal to those who were contributing to our loan payments to consider shifting those gifts to the General Fund.

Last month, I reported that the Council had voted to use funds from the sale of the 6th Street Parsonage to begin several projects. The table below gives a progress update.

replacing the refrigerator in the Parish Hall kitchen	complete
replacing the lighting in the gym with more energy-efficient LED lighting	installation began on March 26
refurbishing the monument sign at the front of our property	The sign has been ordered.

Additionally, the Lower Narthex will be closed during the week of April 9 as the Rejuvenation project begins. During that week, the flooring will be replaced, and the light-abating blinds and ceiling fans will be installed.

The Stewardship Committee: Following some discussion concerning worship and Sunday school attendance and lack of volunteers it was felt there was a need for a coordinated effort between committees and ministries in working on a solution rather than each approaching it from their respective committee. The committee considered community outreach events to introduce ILC to the neighborhood and Pflugerville in general. They also considered ways to approach members who may not attending. Also possible ways to encourage more members to volunteer.

It was also recognized that having three services does present unique problems in that on any one Sunday there is little fellowship between services. It was suggested that at least once a year ILC have only one Sunday service followed by a meal of sorts and fellowship. Something like a reunion of members.

Also suggested that ILC participate in the "National Night Out" by contacting adjoining neighborhoods to join together at ILC for a combined event. A possible Saturday evening service was discussed to provide an alternative to Sundays, where families are involved with other activities that require Sunday participation, such as sporting events. Other items discussed were committee nights and training sessions for ushers, readers and communion assistants.



From the Youth and Family Ministry Office...

As many of you know, I am currently in the midst of a unit of Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE). This is a requirement of most all Masters of Divinity programs and a wonderful, yet challenging, experience that most all pastors have gone through. It is 400 hours of time, 100 curriculum hours and 300 patient contact clinical hours. I have had the privilege to serve at Seton Williamson and Seton Main off of 38th street.

Often, patients will ask me what it is like to be a chaplain or they ask me what are some of the most interesting things about working as a hospital chaplain. I have met so many people and seen some incredibly sad things and some absolutely inspiring things. Yet, there is something that stands out to me I'd like to share with you all.

I have come across folks with regularity who have said in one way or another..."If I don't _____, then God will punish me." Every time this gives me pause and strikes a place within my heart that just makes me sad. My job is not a corrective job nor is it a place that I launch into a lecture about how I believe Scripture tells us differently than that.

I share this with you because false notions like this about God don't erase themselves. It takes people to embrace the challenge and live in a way that shows something different. As the body of Christ, it is our responsibility to live in a way that would proclaim a testament to a God who is not a punishing God but a God steadfast in love and mercy; a God that abounds in grace.

We spent 40 days in the Lenten season singing Joel 2, "Return to the Lord your God, for God is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in **steadfast** love." And now we enter into the season of Easter. A season that lasts more than one day of celebration; a whole season of proclaiming that God defeated death. There is no need for punishment because through the death and resurrection of Christ the WHOLE WORLD has been reconciled to God.

We understand the nature and character of God to be "Because God loves us, therefore we can boldly live in service to God and neighbor"...**NOT**, "If I do right, then God will love me and not punish me". We do not live in fear of wrath and punitive action by God - we live free in the light of the Easter sunrise to declare that because of Jesus therefore we are free; we are free for living...we are free for serving...we are free for boldly loving the world that God so loves.

May you find ways to share that Easter light. May God the Holy Spirit remind you that God is ever present to comfort you, strengthen you and embolden you with courage to live in a way that is a testament to God's mercy, love and grace.
