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Dear Friends of Immanuel Lutheran -



This month I will begin working with you as your transition pastor. I am looking forward to getting to know you and your families. Please take time to introduce yourselves to me. It usually takes me a few Sundays of serving you communion before your name will stick with me, but telling me a simple fact about you helps, too.

Let me tell you a little about myself. I have lived in Austin since 1999. My husband Jon and I moved here fresh out of grad school as computer engineers. We have three children, Zander (junior at Bowie HS), Vivian (freshman at Bowie), and Victoria (6th grade at Small MS). We live in southwest Austin near my parents, Tony and Jocelyn Bechem. My family life is very important to me.

When I began to discern a call into ordained ministry, I also felt a strong calling to remain in Austin. So I enrolled at Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary. (It is adjacent to UT Austin.) I did my Lutheran coursework through Luther Seminary, and graduated in 2016. I completed my internship year at Triumphant Love Lutheran (Austin). One of the things I enjoyed most about my seminary life was the rich diversity in theological thought, and dialog with our ecumenical partners, like Presbyterians, Methodists, and Baptists, and I continue these relationships in ministry today.

My first call was to Shepherd of the Hills (Austin) as the Pastor of Family Ministry. This work is so important to a growing church. I am also a graduate of Leadership Austin, and have been leading teams for over 20 years in corporate work, non-profits, and Lutheran churches. My favorite part of leading worship is sharing communion; my favorite part of being a pastor is being with people. What is your favorite part of worship? I really want to know: I'm an extrovert who loves to hear your stories.

From your Church Council...

At the August meeting, the council took up several important topics and we were joined by members of the congregation and members of the Worship and Music Committee. I hope they all felt they were able to contribute to the conversation and that their thoughts were heard by the council, even if the final decision may not have gone the way that they had hoped. I would like to invite all members of the congregation to attend the council meetings if you are interested. Please contact myself or any council member regarding when or if particular topics of interest might be discussed at a council meeting.

As you will read in a separate communication, the council voted to continue the two worship services on a temporary basis through the end of the year. This was not a decision that the council arrived at quickly or easily. Congregational members that attended the meeting provided many important points to consider regarding the time and number of services. Additional consideration and information will be gathered throughout the fall, prior to the congregational meeting in January.

In addition, the council approved two very important facility projects. The first being the extension of necessary fire alarms into the Parish Hall and the basement, splitting the cost between the church and the Day School. The second item was the selection of contractors to repair the south wall of the gym and the gym flooring. This remediation and repairs has taken a significant amount of work by Melissa Sjolander, Randy Appelhans, and the members of the Property Committee. Our church has been blessed by their efforts and the generous financial contributions that allow us to pay for the repairs. Thank you!

Sunday, September 1 we are excited to have our Transition Pastor, Candice Combs, with us, followed by her first Sunday leading services on Rally Day, Sunday, September 8. Rally Day is always a fun start to the parish education year. We look forward to seeing all of the great things that will be happening at ILC.


