Why do we have "Transition Pastors"?

To tell you the truth, I don't like it when there's no one in charge. I rest easier knowing that there's someone minding the store, so to speak.

What I find equally challenging, is how long it takes to find a pastor these days: did you know it takes 12-18 months? And that's when everyone agrees, and you get the first pastor you find!

For many of us, Immanuel Lutheran Church is at the center of our lives. Our thoughts and prayers, our worship of God, our social life are all connected in some way to this good place. But for many others, church is someplace we see only a few hours each month.

In our 40 hour per week workplaces, when we want to hire someone, we simply write up the job description, and begin interviewing. In contrast, it takes a long time to accrue 40 hours at church if you are a volunteer on the call committee with a full-time job. The job description alone may take several meetings to agree upon. It just takes more time to hire a pastor.

What studies show across all denominations is that churches can thrive with healthy leaders of transition ministry. Having had your previous pastor for 22 years, it is a good rule of thumb that your transition period could take 22 months, give or take. Having your transition time protected with temporary pastoral leadership will help the church pause, look around, and think about the future of Immanuel. When churches do not have a protected time of transition, their next pastor may become an "un-intentional interim," and stay less than four years.

Many of you have expressed concern that I will try to change too many things. Please let me assure you that I do not want to change anything about you! You have a rich history, a healthy discipleship, and much acquired wealth. You are simply amazing. However, if you think that the Spirit of Christ is calling Immanuel to be a little different, then it is my pleasure to protect this time and help your leadership think about making changes that are wholly yours.

I wonder, what kind of spiritual leader does the community of Immanuel need for the next phase of its life?

This years convention was extra special since it was the first time a synodical convention was held in Pflugerville and major planners were from Immanuel. There was an attendance of 100 plus! It was hosted by Capital North and South conferences. Eleven churches were represented on the planning committee which included Becky Boyer, Marie Davis, Sharion Tanner, and Dorothy Kraemer from ILC. Others attending from ILC were Sherry Wukash, Barbara Bohls, Gloria Kuempel, Debbie Wiederhold, and Jane Dunnigan who served as convention nurse.

Churchwide Representative was Elizabeth Burgess and Synod Representative was Deacon Darcy Mittelstaedt. Convention project was Central Texas Table of Grace located in Round Rock. It is an emergency shelter for children ages 6-17 in the foster care system who have nowhere else to go. Friday night activities were held at Immanuel Lutheran Church. This included the opening of the convention, The Holden Evening Prayer worship service, a fun mixer, and refreshments. Business meetings were led by WELCA synodical president, Dinah Halopka. Keynote speaker was Dara Santifer who spoke on Human Trafficking. The Bible study was led by Katie Wegner on I John 4:7. A choice of eight workshops were offered on Saturday afternoon. There were eight exhibitors/vendors.

Saturday evening enjoyed a wonderful banquet meal and entertainment by the Taylor Czech Chorus. The chorus was in costume and invited everyone to join in on a few songs. Silent auction proceeds went to our sister unit in Costa Rica and Table of Grace. Friday night and Sunday morning offering were divided between churchwide, synod, and the Pflugerville Pastor's Fund. Sunday morning closed with a beautiful worship service led by Gethsemane Lutheran. Newly elected and returning board members were installed by Liz Burgess.

The Food Pantry had an exciting few weeks with a field trip from the Day School. The kids were shown how the food pantry works and encouraged to help "fill the pantry." Many thanks to the kids and families who donated! We had another busy month in September with feeding more than 82 families and totaling approximately 267 family members and eight new clients. Thank you for your continued support both with financial donations to the food pantry as well as your continued donations of non-perishable items. Your continued General Fund support is appreciated as church operational expenses continue year round. Please consider designating a portion of your donations to go to the Food Pantry Fund.

The new school year has started and ILC's **Backpack Ministry** is in full swing. The first two weeks we delivered 12 bags and we are gearing up to deliver 60 weekly with a waiting list of at least 20 additional. Each bag will contain a can of chicken noodle soup, ramen, shelf stable milk, cup of mac 'n cheese, individual packages of instant oatmeal, peanut butter crackers, Goldfish, granola bar, cold cereal, fruit cup and popcorn. If fresh fruit (apples or oranges) are donated, 60 pieces are needed and should be delivered to church on Wednesday as the bags are delivered to Ruth Barron Elementary on Thursdays. One more delivery driver is needed and volunteers are needed to help fill bags each week. There is a calendar in the hallway outside the church office and the workroom for persons to sign up. 
