8 My soul clings to you; your right hand upholds me.


Second Reading 1 Corinthians 10:1-13

Paul uses images from Hebrew story and prophecy to speak the truth of Jesus Christ: He is our rock, our water, our food, and our drink. Christ is the living sign of God's faithfulness.

1 I do not want you to be unaware, brothers and sisters, that our ancestors were all under the cloud, and all passed through the sea, 2 and all were baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea, 3 and all ate the same spiritual food, 4 and all drank the same spiritual drink. For they drank from the spiritual rock that followed them, and the rock was Christ. 5 Nevertheless, God was not pleased with most of them, and they were struck down in the wilderness. 6 Now these things occurred as examples for us, so that we might not desire evil as they did. 7 Do not become idolaters as some of them did; as it is written, "The people sat down to eat and drink, and they rose up to play." 8 We must not indulge in sexual immorality as some of them did, and twenty-three thousand fell in a single day. 9 We must not put Christ to the test, as some of them did, and were destroyed by serpents. 10 And do not complain as some of them did, and were destroyed by the destroyer. 11 These things happened to them to serve as an example, and they were written down to instruct us, on whom the ends of the ages have come. 12 So if you think you are standing, watch out that you do not fall. 13 No testing has overtaken you that is not common to everyone. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tested beyond your strength, but with the testing he will also provide the way out so that you may be able to endure it.

Gospel Luke 13:1-9

Asked about current tragic events, Jesus turns a lesson about whether suffering is deserved into a hard call to obedience. He then tells a parable that holds out hope that the timeline for ultimate judgment will be tempered by patience.

1 At that very time there were some present who told him about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. 2 He asked them, "Do you think that because these Galileans suffered in this way they were worse sinners than all other Galileans? 3 No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish as they did. 4 Or those eighteen who were killed when the tower of Siloam fell on them — do you think that they were worse offenders than all the others living in Jerusalem? 5 No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish just as they did." 6 Then he told this parable: "A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard; and he came looking for fruit on it and found none. 7 So he said to the gardener, 'See here! For three years I have come looking for fruit on this fig tree, and still I find none. Cut it down! Why should it be wasting the soil?' 8 He replied, 'Sir, let it alone for one more year, until I dig around it and put manure on it. 9 If it bears fruit next year, well and good; but if not, you can cut it down.'"





2013 Synod Assembly Offering: The Southwestern Texas Synod of the ELC in America receives a special offering at its Assembly each year. This year Cross Trails Ministry has been chosen as the offering recipient for the 2013. Please consider supporting this outreach to our brothers and sisters in Christ in the Southwestern Texas Synod. Make checks payable to Immanuel Lutheran Church, designated to the SWT Assembly Offering.

Thrivent North Travis County Chapter- Thrivent Builds Homes with Austin Habitat for Humanity in 2013: Many of us have previously worked as volunteers with Habitat for Humanity projects, but some of us haven’t done that yet. Perhaps you have imagined that it would be fun to do something completely different from your ordinary routine – THIS IS IT! The building site for the home that will be built is located in northeast Austin, in the University Hills and Windsor Park neighborhood, east of Interstate Highway 35, south of U.S. 290, and west of Northeast Drive. Volunteer construction activities will take place on eight successive Saturdays, beginning on March 30th and ending on May 18th. Our Chapter’s share of the cost of the new home is \$14,767; and we also will need to organize 20-25 volunteer workers, plus provide lunches for 30-35 workers, for each of the eight Saturdays of our project. Pulling everything together in such a short span of time will be challenging for our Chapter – we need YOUR help! If you are interested in helping, please contact Lon Duke at 512/658-1059.

Fabric Kits: During the month of March we are collecting items for Lutheran World Relief fabric kits (formerly sewing kits). ***Why collect fabric kits?*** Teach a person to sew and you've given them tools they can use to earn an income, support their family, and break out of poverty. Many of the thousands of fabric kits that Lutheran World Relief distributes are used in vocational training programs to teach young men and women useful and marketable sewing skills. ***Where do the kits go?*** Tanzania, Angola, Azerbaijan, Botswana, Jordan, Peru, Liberia, Mali, Sierra Leone, Mauritania and Niger. 231,234 kits were sent to these areas in 2011.

One Fabric Kit contains:

Two pieces of cotton or cotton-blend fabric (no knits or 100% polyester); fabric should have no stains or holes and be cut into pieces measuring:

- 2 1/4 yards of 60" wide fabric or,
- 3 yards of 44" wide fabric, or
- 4 yards of 36" wide fabric

Two spools of neutral-colored general purpose thread, 250-300 yards each.

Donated items can be placed in the basket in the lower narthex. There are also envelopes marked for fabric kit monetary donations located in the sanctuary pews, chapel and on the podium in the parish hall. We will be happy to purchase fabric and thread with these donations. The approximate cost of one kit is \$25.00. As with so much, the cost of fabric has increased in the last few years. The appropriate cost to handle and ship one kit is \$1.00. Thank you very much. Contact is Janelle Hebbe at 251-4007.

Technical Enhancements to our facilities, as discussed during the recent congregational meeting, are being handled through the Gift/Inheritance account much like the "Save Our Sanctuary" (new roof on the sanctuary) was handled. Phase one is much needed since it upgrades the service to the chapel. Contributions may be made to Immanuel Lutheran Church Tech Fund.

The Church Council is seeking church members who are **HR professionals** to serve on **Immanuel's Human Resources Committee**. The committee is comprised of the Council President (Mark Sassman), Treasurer (Brent Reeder), and three other members of Immanuel, appointed by the council. The three appointed members serve staggered 2 year terms. If you're interested in serving God by serving Immanuel's staff members, please contact the church office, or any church council member.

Mark Your Calendar: Members of Immanuel will have an opportunity for input and discussion at another Town Hall Meeting to be held in the Parish Hall on April 14th at noon. A light meal will be served. This will be an open forum where members are encouraged to share their concerns, their visions, their hopes & dreams for ILC, the Pflugerville Community and others. The Church Council and representatives from the standing committees will be present to hear your ideas and solutions.
