

Important Church Update: For the last several months, Council has been discussing the constitution changes adopted at the ELCA Churchwide Assembly last summer, as well as updates to our current bylaws and continuing resolutions. There are several outstanding questions the Council would like to resolve before submitting to the congregation for consideration. In addition, the Council wants to ensure there are plenty of opportunities for the congregation to ask questions and review the proposals well in advance of a vote. As a result, the Church Council voted on December 17 to delay consideration of changes to the ILC Constitution, Bylaws, and Continuing Resolutions. The proposal will not be considered at the upcoming January annual congregation meeting.
