

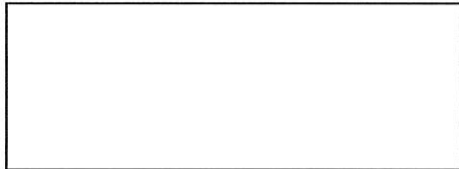

Dear Friends in Christ -

The Lenten season is upon us. It is a wonderful and important time of the year that we Christians celebrate with Wednesday worship and devotions. Here is what's coming up:

- Holden Evening Prayer returns on Wednesdays at 10 a.m. in the chapel, and 6:30 p.m. in the sanctuary. Come enjoy this perennial Lutheran favorite led by our own soloists. The scripture readings will be followed by a guided meditative prayer style, Lectio Divina. It's an ancient practice of listening to God's Word - it soothes the spirit and soul.
- Wilderness: our theme for Sundays in Lent. We rarely enter the wilderness willingly, but through our wandering we remember who we are and whose we are. Listen to the scriptures for way-markers and way-finders to guide our community.
- Check out the Gather Gallery! With thanks to our Crafting Group, we have a temporary gallery in the Gather Room complete with artist's statements. Come learn what Christian artists are inspired to say about the Wilderness.
- Devotionals: This season be guided at home. We have a Wilderness Theme devotional booklet for free, and Janelle Hebbe has "Wonderous Love" available for a small fee from the ELCA.

In other news...In March we have a New Members class continuing, lay communion visitors are being installed (March 8), and our handbell and adult choirs are practicing again for Sunday offerings. Regular Q&A sessions with myself and Council Treasurer, David Hufstedler, are coming up later this Spring. Immanuel is going strong!

**A Message from Immanuel Church Council**

Your Immanuel Lutheran Church Council for 2020 has been elected and our new council term is well underway! We attended a council and staff retreat on February 8 where we discussed goals for the year and worked to strengthen our “Teamwork” for church leadership.

We have many important objectives for this year. We have staff positions to fill and ministry goals to implement. We will be rolling out ministry goals throughout the year. We are working to fill two important staff positions after carefully considering these positions’ goals and requirements. First, the Facilities and Office Administrator is a very important position with many responsibilities, much of which involve our financial transactions and documentation. I feel a profound desire to tell the congregation about the conviction and purpose I observe from our church council members as they work to serve our church. I see the love and devotion to Immanuel by each member as they do the work of their respective committees. It is an honor to work with such a talented and dedicated council. I hope that you get to personally know our council members if you don’t already. We will be open and transparent in the work that we do. If you have questions, we will be glad to answer them.

This is my first message to the congregation as your new president of the 2020 ILC Church Council. This new responsibility for me is great and I am realizing that I have much to learn in order to be a good leader. At the same time, I know this will be a great experience for me and I look forward to a great year. I thank you for putting this trust in me.
