Message From Your Pastor

"In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, 'Where is the child who has been born King of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising and have come to pay him homage.' When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road." (Matthew 2:1-2, 9-12)

This is part of the Gospel that is read on January 6th for the Festival of Epiphany. The manifestation of Jesus is celebrated in this story of traveling to find the new King. Growing up I always enjoyed finding the wise men and placing them out as our nativity collections were displayed. We are uncertain how many there actually were, but what is documented is the gifts given to Jesus. Besides the gold, the gifts of frankincense and myrrh were sweet smelling resins used for burning, anointing, and preparing a body for burial. Even at a young age, the shadow of the cross loomed over Jesus. May you experience the joy of discovering Jesus anew today and always.

Focal verse

"To you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger" (Luke 2:11-12).

Reflection

We found the cat in our garage one morning. She must have snuck in to get away from the cold, and in the early morning my son heard the scratching on our door. Once both children saw her, they were enamored. Our neighborhood is not unfamiliar with random cats but hadn't seen this one before. She looked young. After chasing her around the house and cuddling with her, we left her outside. As we came and went throughout the day, she remained close to our house.

The next day she greeted us again, and we decided to take her to the veterinarian. Like many wild cats, she needed some attention and medicine, but we committed to seeing her to health and to making her part of our family.

I, especially, had no intention of adding another pet to our home. But sometimes unexpected gifts come knocking, and all we can do is accept them with open arms. As a family we're learning to care for this newest addition—pills, creams and all.

The <u>Advent season</u> is packed with unexpected gifts, and we should open our homes and hearts to receive them. <u>Like Mary</u>, we can trust in the goodness of God. Like Joseph, we can listen to our dreams and the angels among us. Like the magi, we can offer what we have. Like the angels, we can sing and share our joy. Like the shepherds, we can keep watch for the beauty before us.

This season, as we wait for the baby born in a manger, reflect on the unexpected gifts in your life: the morning quiet before everyone is awake; decorating cookies and delivering them to neighbors; sitting under the light of the Christmas tree; volunteering at a local soup kitchen or nursing home; reading the story of Jesus' birth as a family and pondering this story in your heart.

However you honor this time, remember that Jesus was born for you and your family. He came into the world so all would know the saving grace of God's love for all the world.

Practices

- Take part in random acts of kindness. Leave a bigger tip at a restaurant or coffee shop. Leave encouraging notes around town. Drop cookies off with neighbors or teachers. Leave treats for postal workers.
- Read a chapter from the Gospel of Luke each day to immerse your family in Jesus' life.

Read <u>'Twas the Season of Advent: Devotions and Stories for the Christmas Season</u> (Zonderkidz, 2021), a great family Advent devotional to study together each day.

Prayer practice

Drive around to see the Christmas lights and nativity displays in your town. Before or after, pray together: Light of the World, thank you for shining your love on us. Help us be beacons of hope for the world. Comfort us. Guide us. And send us forth to tell others of the good news of Jesus' birth.

STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE



WELCA will begin its support of 2024 Lutheran World Relief (LWR) in January by collecting items needed for **Baby Care Kits**. The items requested will provide basic needs for mothers to keep their baby warm, clothed, and clean. 

We hope you will consider donating any of the kit pieces listed below for **sizes 6-24 months**. Items don't have to be brand new, as gently used, clean items (no stains or tears) from the Salvation Army, Goodwill or garage sales may be substituted.

- 1) Lightweight cotton t-shirts (No onesies preferred; however, if you donate onesies, WELCA members can cut and hem into t-shirts)
- 2) Long or short sleeved gowns/sleepers without feet preferred (*Top and pant sets or pajamas sets may be substituted for gowns/sleepers; sleepers with feet can be donated and WELCA members will cut off the feet and hem the legs*)
- 3) Receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with light-weight yarn, up to 52" square (*Fleece blankets are no longer accepted*). Suggestion: Keep an eye out for periodic sales on flannel at local retail stores.
- 4) Cloth diapers (Walmart and Amazon have Gerber 10 pack cloth diapers for approximately \$14, or can also be sewn from flannel material or old t-shirts For instructions visit https://lwr.org/downloads/diaper-tip-sheet
- 5) Hand towels, dark color recommended by LWR.
- 6) Jackets, sweaters, or sweatshirts with hoods if possible or include a baby cap.
- 7) Socks
- 8) Bath-size bars of **gentle soap**, in original wrapping
- 9) Diaper pins or large safety pins (with metal closure vs plastic preferred).

If you ever need a quick reminder later of the items requested, please take a slip from Baby Care posters throughout the church in early 2024. You may drop off all Donations in the WELCA Room.





